### THEO 502 Historical Development of Christian Tradition

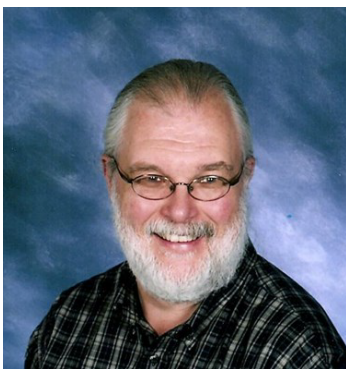

This course studies the development of the Christian theological tradition in its unity and diversity, through the contributions of major theological figures, critical movements within the Christian community and the social context in which theology is formed. It explores a variety of approaches to theological inquiry from classical tradition to modern revisions in interpretation, diversity and the research skills necessary for studying theology today.

Dr. Ken Cuthbertson is a Presbyterian minister in the Presbytery of Santa Fe (PCUSA). His doctoral work in religious studies was done at the University of Iowa, with a specialization in the history of Christianity. He is the author of the book *The Last Presbyterian? - Remembering the Faith of My Forebears* (Resource Publications, 2013).
