### THEO 579 Enculturation and Evangelization

This is offered as an online class.

Students will join the class in De Pere via Google Hangouts during the class times listed above from any venue with internet capabilities.

This course explores the dynamic relationships between Christianity and contemporary culture and societies. It focuses on the development of contextual theologies and the unique challenges and opportunities of postmodern society for shaping a distinct Christian identity. Theories and methods of evangelization and of the “New Evangelization” are examined in light of these new cultural and global realities.



Dr. Howard Ebert

Dr. Howard Ebert began teaching religious studies at St. Norbert College in 1987, specializing in philosophical theology and contemporary Catholic systematic theology. In 1996, he was awarded the Leonard Ledvina Outstanding Teacher Award, an honor he called “humbling; especially considering there are a lot of good teachers here.” In 1999, Ebert was named director of the St. Norbert College Master of Theological Studies Program and, in 2000, he was named division chair of Humanities and Fine Arts. Ebert calls teaching at St. Norbert College a “great privilege” and likes sharing ideas with his students and opening up new worlds to them.
